Funds will support services for victims of abuse, including counseling for victims of domestic violence and sexual assault, secure housing for those in imminent danger, and community education programs designed to increase awareness and prevention of domestic violence, sexual assault, child abuse and trafficking.

The grant funds will provide program support for victims in Port Washington and the surrounding towns in Nassau County.
